The club contracted with a local craftsman to construct six benches to donate to the Town of Barnes. Three benches were placed along the Nip and Tuck walking trail behind the Town office, two benches were placed at Tomahawk Lake Park, and one bench was placed at the landing on the Lower Eau Claire Lake.



We want to highlight the ADA accessible fishing pier, purchased with club funds. Placed at the Tomahawk Lake Park, the deck is 48' long, and the fishing area is 15' wide by 8' long. There are two 4-foot long seats on either side and a 34" railing all around. We think the new dock offers plenty of opportunity for catching fish!





The club scatter-planted 9,000 extended-length walleye on the Upper Eau Claire Lake and 6,000 on the Lower Eau Lake. The weather presented the greatest challenge to club members and volunteers at both the Upper and Lower lakes for the September and October dates. Strong winds(20 mph) and driving rain, and snow(on the Upper) made the effort difficult, prompting DNR personnel to comment that they've never seen a more dedicated group. A great compliment, way to go!!!


