Sweet Lake (r), Schunenberg Lake (m), and Smith Lake (l) at the headwaters of the Eau Claire Lake chain. These three connected lakes flow left into Upper Eau Claire Lake.





Murray Lake (lower left), Loon Lake (upper)and Sand Lake (with island) were inventoried using the Type 1 level survey protocol. Photo looks easterly.

Beauregard Lake (from south) Nearby Rock Lake was not photographed.





Sandbar and Tomahawk, both contain EWM. Priest Lake is a private access lake and was not surveyed.

Seepage lakes, often referred to as the Potawatomie Lakes, from right. (Sandbar, Turtle, George, Breakfast, Island, and Ole.)





Ellison Lake (foreground) does not have a public boat landing, but there is private access used. The lake was surveyed by a Level 1 survey protocol and also a sign was installed.
