The present Emergency Service building serves both the Ambulance Department and the Fire Department and is attached to the Town Highway Department building.


The Emergency Services stalls have three doors housing four, first-out, vehicles. One truck must be backed in at an angle to fit all vehicles in the space. Trucks are moved out of the building for maintenance due to lack of working area.

Construction of Ambulance/Fire Hall up to \$500,000 was approved by voters at November 2019 Budget Meeting.

Future Plans

The Emergency Services Building was designed to meet today's needs while planning for the future.

The new building will have four doors, allowing each first-out emergency response vehicle to have its own door. The building will allow maintenance and inventory to be completed in a safe and comprehensive manner.

Due to current national shortage of emergency personnel in rural areas, overnight accommodations in the new building will be available to encourage EMTs from other areas to enjoy a working vacation offering their skills on -call while enjoying the Barnes area.

The Town Board and EMS Committee continue to research partnerships with other agencies, EMS programs and grants. We continue to urge Bayfield County to research a county-wide EMS, using EMTs and Paramedics along with individual towns' emergency vehicles and buildings. In the event that this becomes a reality, our new building design and location may be instrumental.

The Town Board is currently searching for a Full-Time EMT.
